B. Land Use- Rodger Reinhart: The parking lot project is still in progress. A variance to the LCP will be needed to credit these parking spaces to the local merchants. The response rate to the income survey for the sewer sytem grant wa too low for the grant to be submitted. The surveys will be handed out to the non-respondents and can be mailed to Steve Hartsell.

C. Flood Committee -Roy Brixen:

1.) Shade cloth still needs to be purchased for the P.C. Rd. flood wall. It's \$385/roll and 4 rolls are needed. GA responded that he could get it wholesale from the nursery industry. All the other necessary items are on hand.

2.) The FEMA Area IX representative position in San Francisco is vacant and there is no one to contact at this time to get more information for homeowner assistance in raising their foundations.

3.) John Donovan raised a concern about the amount of sediment in the lagoon. Steve Simms is working on getting funds to study the water quality; State Parks is working on maintaining the gate mechanism. HH reported that the flow rate this year is 3x normal-10cfs vs. 3cfs.

D. Website update -Rodger Reinhart: The Pescadero Foundation is requesting a link on the PMAC website. This would be a temporary situation and would be limited to 1 page. It was decided that this would be OK as well as allowing other non-profit community organizations the same service if requested.

E. Public Works - roads and water - Herb Hamor: There was very little response from the residents to the notice about speed bumps on North Street, so this issue will be tabled for now.

Water consumption in CSA 11 is down 20% compared to last year at this time-most likely due to the extra weeks of rain this Spring.

HH also brought up an issue that a resident whose domestic well collapsed will be unable to replace it until reviewed by the Coastal Commission. PMAC is willing to write a letter on behalf of any resident who needs our help in appealing such a decision.

E. Community Services - Paisley Nash-Dooley: Tess Black is unable to be the editor of the community newsletter, so it's unlikely there will be one before the first of the year. The next meeting of this committee is 7/24, location TBA.

G. Environmental Issues - Jackson Robertson: JR has been developing contacts with people from HMB down to Costanoa, getting their input on environmental concerns. Date, time and location of his first meeting TBA.

8. OLD BUSINESS:

Search for new PMAC candidates for District 1, Loma Mar, and At Large is still underway.

9. NEW BUSINESS:

A. Keeping the buses going—we need a liaison to SamTrans

~800 people/month are using this service; Sam Trans is unwilling to take on Sam Coast. Lary Lawson provided CP with 2 names of people who might be able to help.

B. We need to form a committee to deal with fire suppression in town.

This issue was discussed-no action taken at this time.

C. What does Loma Mar need, and how can we help?

2 Loma Mar residents attended the first part of the meeting, but had no requests at this time.
